HRGBC Tour of the Commonwealth's Largest Solar Array Tuesday, October 22 at 1 p.m.



The expansive solar array visible when traveling east bound on the Hampton Roads Bridge Tunnel is, by far, the largest in the Commonwealth. Rated at 2.1 MW the Monkey Bottom installation at the Norfolk Naval Station consists of over 8,000 panels covering 10 acres. The system went online at the end of 2012 and provides about 2% of the Naval facility's power. Bay Electric of Newport News installed the American made SolarWorld Panels with design assistance from the Blue Sky Group, of Venice, FL.
